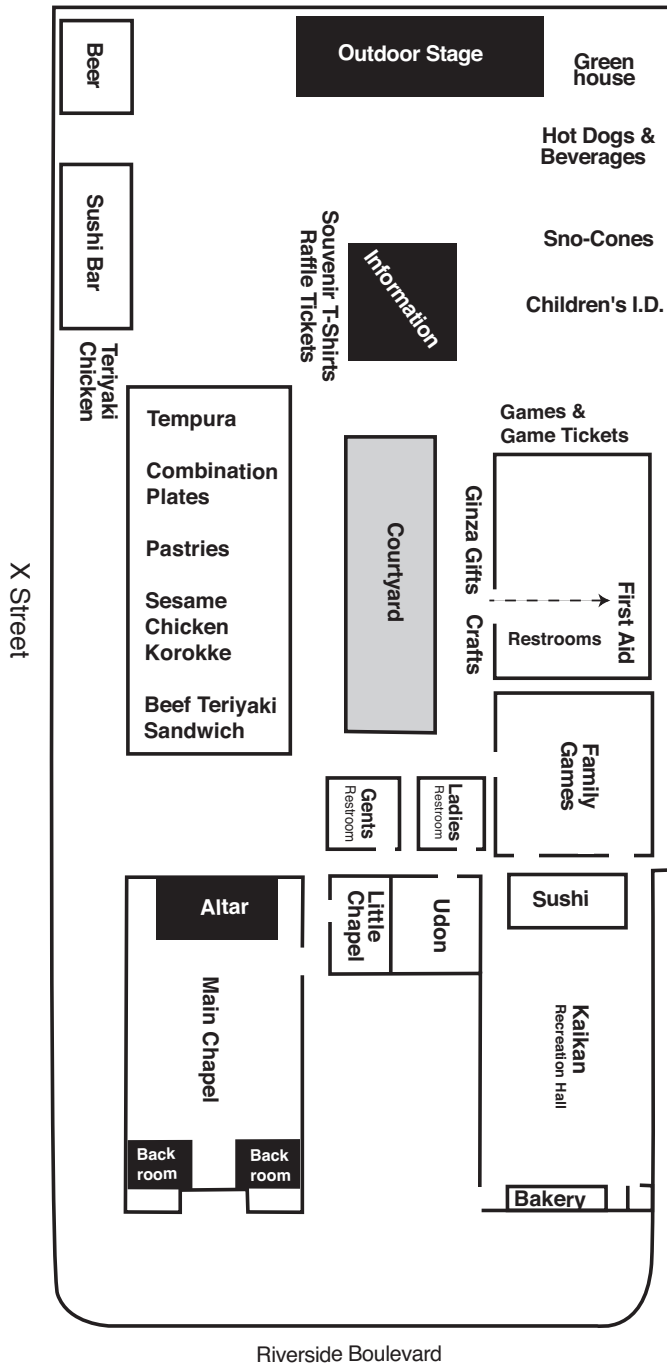


Floor Plan of the Sacramento
